#### SECTION 4: First aid measures

##### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

<b>Inhalation</b>	Move affected person to fresh air and keep warm and at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Get medical attention if symptoms are severe or persist.
<b>Ingestion</b>	Do not induce vomiting. Give plenty of water to drink. If vomiting occurs, the head should be kept low so that vomit does not enter the lungs.
